







Sexually Transmitted Infections




- Robeson County ranked #9 with 27 cases, alongside Buncombe & Cabarrus

Newly Diagnosed AIDS Cases in 2022


- Robeson County ranked #9 with 12 cases
- Mecklenburg ranked #1 with 154, Wake ranked #2 with 63 & Forsyth ranked #3 with 37







